

Cottage

Each of our cottages is equipped with four beds, a refrigerator, and a TV. The cottages themselves don't have Wi-Fi access, but rental Wi-Fi devices are available for \$2 per night if you need to access the Internet.

Cooking

The public area, which is located outdoors, has kitchens for several families and you can cook only there. Cooking utensils are available with no additional fee. If you need them, just let us know when you make a reservation. There is a supermarket near the campground, so you don't have to bring large amounts of food from home.

Others

Shower rooms are in the public space and you can use them for up to 20 minutes a day. In the shower room, you can use amenities such as soap and shampoo, which are offered at the reception. As for garbage disposal, please dispose of food scraps in the garbage dump and take home all other garbage with you.

Comments from users

- The campground is easy to access because it is a ten-minute walk from the station. For those who have a lot of baggage for camping, free shuttle buses are in service from the station to the campground. On the other hand, if you want to bring your pet, it is the best to drive there yourself.
- When I went deep into the forest of the campground, I saw various animals such as deer, squirrels, and woodpeckers. Also, many people were camping with their pets, so I felt as if I was in a small zoo!
- I was happy to see my wife and kids enjoying nature. But unfortunately, we couldn't make a campfire because the use of fire is banned in the campground except in the public area, which was so crowded that it would have been impossible for my family to enjoy a campfire alone.
- My first time camping with my dog was very exciting. However, I regret forgetting to bring a pet cage because my dog was so excited that he ran around in the cottage while I was sleeping.

B You are the editor of "Wanna See Japan," an English website promoting tourism in Japan. You have received an article from David, an American travel journalist, in which he wrote about Japan's international airports and sightseeing spots.

More than half of the tourists visiting Japan use two airports: Narita International Airport (NRT) and Kansai International Airport (KIX). NRT had long been the most important airport in Japan, but in recent years KIX has become increasingly popular, especially among travelers from Asian countries.



Do you know which country or region sends the most visitors to KIX? In 2019, China ranked first, South Korea second, Taiwan third, Hong Kong fourth, and Thailand fifth. So, where do these people visit after arriving at KIX?

An analysis of search data from a navigation app for tourists visiting Japan shows that Osaka Castle is most frequently searched by foreign tourists, followed by Kinkakuji Temple, Nara Park, Tokyo Tower, Fushimi Inari Shrine, Dotonbori, and Universal Studios Japan. Amazingly, three of the top seven spots are in Osaka.

Why is Osaka so popular among foreign visitors to Japan? According to the 2017 survey of 1,236 foreign tourists at KIX, the reasons for choosing Osaka as a destination were as follows: 48% of them said it was an attractive place to visit, 44% said the food was appealing, and 41% said shopping was attractive. 26% of them said they would visit Dotonbori, where almost all of them wanted to enjoy Osaka's unique cuisine such as *takoyaki*, *okonomiyaki*, and *kushikatsu*.

It is hoped that KIX will be crowded with more foreign tourists in the future: the World Exposition will be held in Osaka in 2025. Approximately 28 million people are expected to visit the Expo over the period of six months.

B Your history club will hold a "history experience exhibition" at the school festival. For reference, you are reading an article written by a professor who had his students experience the culture of England in old times.

In order to have my students experience the life of people in 19th century England, I had to consider several things.

A You are going to hold a discussion on the history of fashion in a class. You are making a summary of the following article. Using the summary, you will talk about it.

History of Cosmetics

The earliest use of makeup was not necessarily for the purpose of seeking beauty. The ancient Egyptians, both men and women, would paint *kohl*, a mixture of lead, iron, copper, ash and burnt almonds, around their eyes. The circles of kohl were thought to drive away evil spirits and to relieve the effect of the harsh desert sun on their eyes. Today, scientists think that the kohl makeup may also have helped protect the Egyptians from infectious diseases since the lead would kill off bacteria, though they could not have known this at the time. In addition to Egyptians, ancient Greeks, Romans and Chinese are also believed to have worn some kind of makeup on their face.

During the European Middle Ages, pale skin was popular, as it was a sign of wealth. Women painted their faces and necks with a mixture of lead and vinegar to lighten the face, which was actually harmful to the wearer. Elizabeth I of England, with her white face and large forehead, is famous for this look, which was popular for centuries. Around the same time, however, cosmetics became recognized as a health threat.

Towards the end of the 1800s, portrait photography became popular. Putting on some makeup before having one's photo taken became common. Mirrors also became readily available to ordinary people. To be sure, these two factors were important in making makeup common among the general public, but nothing played a greater role than motion pictures. When actors were on the stage, they usually wore very heavy makeup that made them appealing to the audience sitting far from the stage. But faces with such makeup did not look good on the screen. So, in 1914, Max Factor, a Polish businessman who provided wigs to Hollywood studios,

developed a new type of paint for foundation that made actors look better through a camera. In the 1920s, he began selling his makeup to the public with the claims that they could look like their favorite movie stars. His products proved very successful.

Around the same time, the US car companies began to use new paints in multiple colors on their vehicles. The main ingredients of the paints were nitrocellulose, a substance which was also used to make gun powder. As this paint dried faster than traditional ones, cosmetics companies wondered if they could use it for nail polish, a cosmetic paint that is applied to the nails. In 1932, the first nail polish using the same material as that used in car paint appeared on the market. Revlon, the manufacturer of this product, successfully promoted it and it soon became popular. Also, in the 1950s, the company ran campaigns for matching nail polishes and lipsticks. One of their advertisements said, "If you are the type of woman who wants to bleach your hair platinum without your husband's consent, then you are the perfect candidate for this new color of lipstick and nail polish." In fact, the ad accelerated the sales of the polish.

The popularity of false nails, or artificial nail products which people put over their natural fingernails, among ordinary people accidentally began in 1954, when a US dentist named Frederick Slack damaged his fingernail while at work. He put an artificial nail over his damaged one, using dental acrylics, material used for mending bad teeth. Since then, false nails have progressed into what is worn by many people today as a beautiful fashion.

Throughout history, humans have tried putting on some sort of artificial materials on themselves. Especially in the modern era, they have added to themselves what they expect to make them more confident and happier, or else to cover up parts of their body they don't like. Can you imagine how people will look 100 years from now? They might be wearing 'fashionable' nose paint, or false ears. Who knows?

B You are preparing for a presentation on strange creatures for your science class. You are using the following article for your presentation.

Human fathers may be better than those of other creatures in their active involvement in child-raising. They teach their children how to play a ball game, or how to behave in a decent way. But, in one particular respect, human fathers can never beat the males of certain species, which become pregnant and give birth to their children instead of the females. This trait is peculiar to a strange kind of fish, widely known as "seahorses." Like a kangaroo, a male seahorse has a pocket of skin on its stomach to carry babies in. A female produces eggs and transfers them into her mate's pocket, where they hatch. The pocket can hold as many as 2,000 babies at a time. By keeping the babies inside the pocket, the father offers oxygen and necessary nutrients to the babies as well as protects them from the dangers in the sea.

The reproduction of seahorses begins when a male and a female seahorse start to dance together before dawn, twisting their tails, changing their body color, and swimming side by side. Eventually, they engage in a true dance of courtship, that is, a request for mating. In this phase, the movements of the couple synchronize so that the male can easily receive the eggs when the female is ready to lay them. The male inflates his pocket with water to show that it is empty. The process ends when the male has received the eggs. The pregnancy lasts 10 to 25 days, depending on the species. The eggs hatch in the father's pocket, and then the father swims a long distance to set the newborn babies free.

What evolutionary advantages does male pregnancy give seahorses? Science has not yet revealed the truth. One theory is that it enables a shorter cycle of reproduction by sharing the burden of the process between the father and the mother. While the father is keeping the babies in his pocket, the mother can prepare more eggs to give to the father soon after he has set the babies free. It is said that some seahorses can give birth in the morning and be pregnant again by evening.

Seahorses range from less than one to thirty centimeters in length. They have

some unique characteristics in appearance. For example, they have a tube-shaped mouth for sucking in very tiny sea creatures as food, a curling tail for clinging to sea grass to avoid drifting, and hard plates that cover their body for protection. The plates make them less attractive as food to predators. The exception is humans, who have caught them to make some traditional medicines.

Then, what is the current population of seahorses? No such statistical data exists because relatively little research on them has been carried out so far. But fishers have mentioned a decline in the number of seahorses they catch, according to some research on seahorses. It is also pointed out by scientists that seahorses have been threatened by the damage caused by humans to the coastal areas they live in as well as overfishing for the purpose mentioned above.

Scientists have been trying to save seahorses by breeding them in water pools. Breeding seahorses in captivity, however, is not easy, partly because the babies are so tiny that it is hard to keep them alive. They cannot eat most of the tiny plankton that is usually eaten by grownup seahorses. So, special baby food has to be grown for them. New technologies for more efficient breeding are under way now.

Once a seahorse father sets the babies free in the ocean, the parents do not provide their tiny children with any care or protection. Infant seahorses can easily fall victim to predators or be swept away by ocean currents, where they drift away from their feeding areas. Only about five infant seahorses in every 1,000 survive to adulthood. If only seahorse parents would make half the effort that human parents do to protect their children after birth! In this respect, human fathers do surpass seahorses.






